The LiveSimply award is a scheme for communities and schools who can show how they have been living:

The award celebrates what we do already and inspires us to do more. It helps our community live, not just more simply, but also more fully.

In our application for the LiveSimply Award we have said that we will take action to nurture God's creatures (e.g. creating bird/bat boxes, by building bug hotels, making bird feeders and creating hedgehog homes). We have also installed two bee hives in the wild-flower garden and we will be able to produce our own honey, as well as getting interested pupils involved in caring for the hives.
