Catch Up Premium Strategy 2019-20

The school expects to receive approximately £12,000 additional funding in 2019-20 to support pupils in Year 7 who were well below average in either English or maths when they entered the school in September. This extra funding is known as the Catch Up Premium. We have increased this allocation from our own school budget. The table below shows how this funding is to be used to support this group of learners.

Pupils are identified through year 6 data, our own tests during July before entry and staff feedback to identify students well below national standards in reading, writing and maths.
