



### Home Learning Expectations

Buckingham Primary Academy are using two ways to communicate home learning to our families.

School will:

- Ensure that weekly 'home learning' grids are available on our website, twitter and classdojo. This will be linked to your child's enquiry question every Monday by 8.30am.
- Provide daily phonics or SPaG activities and challenges bespoke to your child's ability.
- Provide daily English and maths activities linked to your child's age and ability
- Ensure teachers and teaching assistants will support children in their activities and give feedback
- Provide updates to parents through 'Classdojo' and Twitter

Parents will:

- Ensure they log into 'Class Dojo' daily
- Ensure your child has access to their home learning through classdojo and the school website: <https://www.buckinghamprimaryacademy.net>
- Ask for support and advice from staff at Buckingham Primary Academy
- Ensure your child posts their work onto their 'Dojo' portfolio

Children will:

- Look at the school website and class dojo every day to find out their home learning activity
- Complete weekly home learning challenges
- Complete work set and share with their teacher on class dojo
- Talk to their teacher and other staff at Buckingham Primary Academy through 'class dojo'
- Ask for help from their teachers whenever they need it
- Encourage your child to read or share a book daily with someone else in your household.

Top Tips for successful home learning

Get into a routine and stick to it!!!

- Set aside times for 2 – 3 hours of learning each day
- Set times for your child to have a break from learning for exercise / a drink / a snack
- Set up an area in your home for your child to access their learning
- Encourage siblings to help and support each other with their learning
- Set up a learning space
- Use other parts of the day to teach your child new skills such as: How to tie their shoelaces, baking.

Remember learning from home is different to learning at school. Your child's class teacher will be available to offer support and advice. We know you and your child will be doing a great job.
