Year 3: Why do so many people go to the Mediterranean for their holidays?

National Curriculum Program of study and Key

skills - Geography

- Begin to ask geographical questions
- Use, atlases, pictures/photos and internet as sources of information.
- Investigate places and themes at more than one scale
- Use 4 compass points to follow/give directions:
- · Use letter/no. co-ordinates to locate features on a map
- Try to make a map of a short route experienced, with features in correct order;
- Locate places on larger scale maps e.g. map of Europe. Follow a route on a map with some accuracy.
- Begin to match boundaries (E.g. find same boundary of a country on different scale maps.)

National Curriculum Program of study - Science:

KS2 Science (Y3 Animals including Humans)

- identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat
- identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

Year 1 - Animals Including Humans

 identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body

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Year 2 - Animals Including Humans

- find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
- describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

Year 2 - Living Things and Their Habitats

 describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.
