### IMPORTANT NOTICE: School Meal Price Increase

Parents & carers may have seen this week's press release in the Hull Daily Mail regarding a price increase for school meals. Children in FS2 to Y2 will not be affected, however parents with children in years 3 to 6 will see meals increase from 50p to £1.00 with effect from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> January 2018. The decision has not been taken lightly and is the result of negotiations between the Hull Association of Head teachers and Hull City Council. As a school we appreciate that this is short notice and encourage all parents and carers to apply for free school meals to check their entitlement. This can be done by completing a free school meal form, available from the school office, or by visiting <https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims>

Please note: The Hull Daily Mail are encouraging parents to apply for free school meals via Hull City Council, however the council will not process applications for Buckingham Primary Academy pupils as free school meal applications are administered in house by Mrs Elder. The link for the Buckingham Primary Academy's free school meal application portal is available on the school website and parents and carers will receive a link by text to the portal before we break up for Christmas.

We encourage all parents and carers to apply for free school meals regardless of circumstance or which year group your child is in. The information you provide will be automatically rechecked by our system so that if your child does become eligible we can notify you that you will no longer have to pay for child's meals. It will also allow us to check eligibility before your child moves up to year 3.

**Parents and carers who apply for free school meals will be automatically entered into a draw with a chance of winning a prize!**

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the increase or free school meal applications, please speak to Mrs Elder who is always more than happy to help.

### Fees and Voluntary Contributions

Thank you so much to those parents & carers who have supported our efforts to create a safe, secure and cashless school. There are currently less parents & carers, than before, who owe the school money for payment items such as school meals, after school clubs, After School Provision and FS1 lunch fees, however we aren't quite there yet.

Non-payment of fees or a shortfall in voluntary contributions for payment items such as school trips have a direct impact on the school's already overstretched budget. Please help us to continue providing the above services and optional extras by clearing any outstanding balances and by making future payments within the allocated time scales.

Please note: the school covers part of the costs for the above services, optional extras and school trips. Unpaid fees will result in some or all services being withdrawn.

If you are experiencing difficulties making payment, we kindly ask that you do not ignore letters or phone calls and instead contact the school office as a matter of urgency. Mrs Elder is more than happy to discuss any concerns you may have and work with you to make suitable arrangements.
