We have had quite a lot of parents dropping items of for their children during the school day. Can you please ensure that your child has everything they need before arriving at school? This causes less disruption during the school day. Your support is much appreciated.

# COVID Update

As you will be aware, the Government are now in the process of reducing the current restrictions again on 24<sup>th</sup> February.

We must still follow the advice from Tameside Public Health if children have symptoms. Therefore, if your child has any of the main symptoms they are still advised to get a PCR test. If they have taken a LFD test at home, and it's positive, that result will stand and they don't need to get a confirmatory PCR. But if the child is presenting with the COVID symptoms, this includes high temperature, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, the advice is still to **book a PCR test**. We've taken the following from the warn & inform issued to parents by Tameside's Public Health.

#### What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must isolate and you should arrange a PCR test for your child via https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested or by calling 119.
