## Communication and Language

At the moment your child is bringing home a wordless book to read. Try to share this book daily and each day you revisit there will always be something else to think and talk about. Ask questions:

Who is in the story?

What is happening?

Where is this happening?

'What if' and 'I wonder' questions will get your child to use their imagination.

Create your own story. Use 3 or 4 objects and make up a story or sentence.



## Phonics

During every day activities encourage your child to find or think of things with the initial sound e.g. 's', 'a', 't' and 'p'.

The new sounds we learn will be sent on Tapestry at the end of each week.



## Maths

### Subitising

This is the ability to look at a small number of objects and instantly recognise how many objects there are without needing to count.

Encourage subitising throughout the day. Look around and ask your child, **What do you see? How do you see it?**

E.g. laying the table, Ducks in the bath, Pebbles on the pavement, sweets on the table, people on the settee, sausages on the plate.
