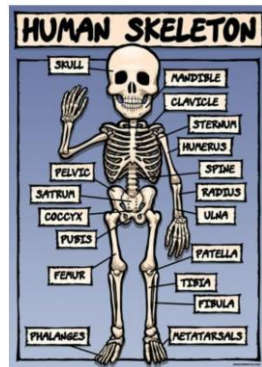


## Science
