

Poisonous Plants Information

Any potentially dangerous plants and bulbs on the premises should be covered in your risk assessment taking into account:

- The level of supervision required
- How children with allergies might be affected
- Restricted access to a 'garden' area
- Alerting parents to hazardous shrubs in the immediate vicinity of the setting.

The following is a list of some of England's most readily available, commonly grown plants which are *very* poisonous.
