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Covid -19 Update

As noted previously, the Lateral Flow Testing Programme is expected to continue during the half term week. Please take tests on Sunday night or Monday, then again on Thursday and then followed by Sunday/Monday again before we return to school. Tests should be recorded on the government's site as well as directly to school. If any test is positive, please email <u>enquiries@burscoughprioryacademy.org</u> to highlight this to school. Following the positive test, all of the family (or bubble) should self-isolate and the individual must book a PCR test. Following the result of the PCR test, this should also be reported to school.

Since our last update about the use of face coverings, we received a further update from the public health officials supported by the local authority which recommended that all students and staff continue to wear them until mid-June, right across Lancashire. Sensibly, like our colleagues right across the county, we will adhere to this advice. This will be in classroom and communal areas in school for both our staff and students. Attached to this letter you will find a copy of the update from Dr Sakthi Karunanithi, Director of Public Health for Lancashire.

On the first day of the new term, we will have an assembly and a session to outline (and give practise time) to some simple changes in school routines. Monday 7 June will follow all of the routines that are in place today. In summary, the revised routines that will start from Tuesday 8 June are:

- Year 7 will use the front gate (on Trevor Road) to enter site in the morning and move to the back yard via the green gate
- Year 7 (and 8) will use the front gate at the end of the day, leaving site at 3.10pm
- Year 9 and 10 will continue to use the front gate at the end of the day leaving site at 3.15pm
- Students will line up for lessons on the yard at 8.45am, after break and lunchtime
- In between some lessons, students will move around the school following the designated (and strict) one-way system whilst wearing masks.

Despite all of the challenges we have faced over the past fifteen months, we take nothing for granted and often pause to reflect on how much this community has achieved together. On behalf of all of the staff, we wish everyone a safe and enjoyable half term break. We look forward to greeting the students in Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 on Monday 7 June at 8.45am for a fantastic final term of the year.
