Strike Action by Members of the National Education Union (NEU) 28 February 2023

Dear Parent,

As outlined in the end of term letter, we are writing to you with an update about plans for next Tuesday 28 February, the first planned day of industrial action by the NEU.

Due to the high number of staff that are in the NEU, there will be major disruption to our school provision on this day. We have completed a detailed risk assessment considering the impact that the action will have on the health and safety of our children, staff and visitors. It is important to reiterate that this is not industrial action against the school, it is as part of a schedule of national action. It is because the NEU states that it has a trade dispute with the Secretary of State for Education.

As a result of this assessment, we will offer face-to-face provision to cater for the individual needs of a small number of children. If your child is in this group, like last time, you will receive an email with an invite into school and a link to an online form to register to confirm that your child is accepting or declining the offered place. This means everyone is accounted for and we know exactly who we will expect to attend next Tuesday at 8.45am. If you need the school bus service, please indicate this on the form and then we can confirm or cancel the service.

This means that for all other students in Year 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11, school will be closed on Tuesday. If you have a specific concern about your child, especially if they are in Year 7 or 8 and their supervision on the day, please contact us and we will consider this on a case-by-case basis.

This means that:

- We will offer face-to-face provision to cater for the individual needs of a small number of children between 8.45 and 3.15. Breakfast Club, Homework Club and all afterschool activities are postponed. Students who have a confirmed place on Tuesday should wear their school uniform as normal and report to Reception at the start of the day. Break and lunchtime service will be available for students who attend school.
- For all other students in Year 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11, school will be closed and homework and/or remote learning will be their priority for the day.

Free School Meals

Students who are eligible for free school meals have the opportunity to order one for Tuesday lunchtime - this must be pre ordered in advance and collected from school on Tuesday at 12.30pm. Please see the email that follows with a personalised link to complete an order for lunch.

Remote Learning
