End of Term Letter

As we come to the end of this term, we would like to give you an update about the end of term arrangements, our achievements and consider the start of the summer term.

Reflecting on the Spring Term

Over and above the hundreds of hours of learning:

- Maths have marked national 'Pi' day, English led the activities for World Book Day and Science celebrated National Science Week
- A fantastic Creative Evening we really do have some talented young people!
- A full extra-curricular activities programme has started: Eco Committee, Debate Club, Pride Academy LGBTQ+ group, Games Club, Music activities and Chess Club amongst others
- Regular participation in a range of sport and physical activities across West Lancashire and success in several tournaments in the district.
- Two excellent PSHE days included education about staying safe online, first aid and a fantastic trip to the Anglican Cathedral and Mosque in Liverpool. We were delighted that both places of worship noted the excellent attitudes and the conduct of our students
- The Year 9 students took part in the West Lancashire Careers Fayre and showcased their extraordinary focus on careers and their aspirations
- A range of Parents' Evenings for Year 9, 10 and 11 and the Options Evening
- We continue our journey to achieve the 'Rainbow Flag Award' which recognises a school's commitment to a being a fully supportive and inclusive environment for people who form a part of or who are allies of the LGBTQ+ community – three out of five stages are completed and awarded.
- We were delighted to receive the names of the Year 6 students who selected BPA for their high school for September 2023 the Class of 2028. For the second consecutive year, we are 'oversubscribed,' more choices than places and testament to the school's improvement. We cannot wait to meet the newest members of the school and the transition process has started in earnest.





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Year 11 have nearly completed their coursework in school. As we leave this term, their final full one in school, we would like to wish them all the very best of luck as they move towards the GCSE examinations starting on 15 May 2022, with the speaking exams in Spanish and Art exams in the weeks leading up to May. Of course, we urge them to work hard and revise in preparation for the exams, but we are also looking forward to a range of traditional valedictory activities in the weeks and months to come. Next week you will receive more information about the range of celebratory activities and all of the deadlines that we have agreed with providers and suppliers.

Staffing Changes

Over the course of this term, Miss Bristow, Miss Sloan and Mrs Walker have returned from their respective maternity leave. In previous correspondence we have bid farewell to the staff who have been in post, covering for them. However, we do say a goodbye and good luck in her new post to Mrs McDonough in English. Mrs Ashcroft, responsible for our reading intervention programme, leaves us after securing a promotion in another Lancashire school. We wish her well and thank her on behalf of all of our students – the impact on reading and the confidence of students has been remarkable. This important position will be readvertised next week.

Rewards and Awards

The end of term nominations have been completed by the staff team to recognise the engagement and learning of students right across the year groups and range of subjects. This morning, the prize nominees (of which there are an unbelievable 390), received their certificates in House assemblies and earlier this week, the parents of our award winners were notified on ClassCharts. We are very proud of the first-class levels of engagement and the excellence in subject areas that are consistently demonstrated in school and that will be recognised.

Overall, we are really proud of the way our students present themselves. As we return after the Easter break, we would like to remind everyone of our expectations related to uniform; on the first day of term, we will complete a check of standards and your support to enable the students to meet the policy is crucial. 
- Knee length skirts [which are unrolled]

- A non-smart watch
