Free School Meal Vouchers & Holiday, Activity, Food Programme (HAF)

As is customary, the vouchers for students who are eligible for free school meals will be distributed via the Edenred Platform. Please look out for the email, in junk as well. If you have any difficulty, please get in touch with us.

Over the summer holidays, funding from the government will allow students from BPA who are in receipt of Free School Meals to access a range of activities as well as a food offer. Activities will take place over the course of the summer. To see what is on offer, visit the brand-new West Lancashire HAF website at https://westlancashirehaf.com and have your email and code available so that you can login and complete the booking form fully in order to reserve a place for the weeks to come. Places will be allocated on a first come first served basis, so we would encourage you to sign up for these places as soon as possible. Please note that unlike previous years, Lancashire County Council are administering the programme, hence the email from an external source and not school.

Information about 2024 -2025

Here are the revised timings for the school day, noting that the start and end is unchanged. This starts on 4.9.24 and the students have been updated today, in assembly:

After much consultation with staff and students, we have made the decision to move Tutor time to the morning so that a key part of this can be about preparing for the school day and week ahead. The legal registration session for attendance marks, in line with statute, will close at 9.15am to safeguard our students. After this, late, without a good reason or evidence, an unauthorised absence will be recorded. This reinforces the need for a punctual start to the day.

Break and lunch have changed time as you may note, bringing us in line with a lot of schools in West Lancashire. Breakfast is really important and we would advise our students to eat first thing. Students who are eligible for free school meals are entitled to a breakfast and use their fingerprint in the normal way. If a student does not use their allowance in the morning, they will be able to use it at break time. However, we would always urge students to eat first thing so that they are fuelled for the morning, have a snack later on, followed by their lunch.



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Furthermore, our fantastic Catering Team have been busy revising the offer so that more cold options (sandwiches and pasta) will be available at break because this may be a more preferable time to eat.

Uniform & Equipment

Ahead of September, we would like to take this opportunity to remind you about the revised Uniform and Appearance Policy. A more detailed letter about uniform expectations accompanies this letter.

- Skirts must be knee length at the start and unrolled of the year to allow for growth
- Shoes must be leather look, sturdy shoes in line with the models in the uniform letter
- Mid-calf socks are permitted (not long ones rolled down)
- Regular fit, charcoal grey tailored shorts with grey socks and shoes in line with expectations are now permitted
- All books in school will be A4 next year. School bags should be large enough to hold books and folders of this size.
