End of Spring Term

As we come to the end of this term, we would like to give you an update about the end of term arrangements, our achievements and consider the start of the summer term.

End of Term

With an average attendance of 89% on the last day of term – it is very easy to succumb to the 'it's not a real day' or 'it's not that important,' train of thought. It is a critical day in school, we celebrate the achievements of our students and recognise their hard work. It is important that our students are celebrated and in the spirit of our values, recognise their friends, members of the school community and our partners across the Trust. So, we urge, let's make this this best attended day ever so we can finish the term on a real high, relishing in the achievements of our young people.

Friday is the end of the spring term and to finish, students will be in normal lessons, have a tutor session and then their Celebration & Assembly. Some Year 11 students are going on a trip — enjoy! It will be a non-uniform day, if students do want to wear their own regular clothes, uniform or PE kit, all are permissible. If you can, in return for non-uniform, we would request a chocolate or treat donation brought in advance that will be gifted to our local care homes and the village Foodbank.

We will have an extended food offer mid-morning and students eligible for a free school meal will have their monies available for a meal. Reflecting on the Spring Term

To date, since Christmas, 242,859 Arbor points have been awarded – congratulations everyone! This week, the end of term nominations have been completed by staff to recognise the engagement and





learning of students across the year groups and range of subjects. On Friday morning, the prize nominees (of which there are an amazing 381), will received their certificates in House assemblies

and the parents of our award winners will be notified. We are very proud of the first-class levels of engagement and the excellence that is consistently demonstrated will be recognised.

Over and above the hundreds of hours of learning, school continues to be a hub of activity: STEM, sport, music, chess, peer reading and countless other enrichment opportunities. Our students have participated in the full range of activities and been acknowledged with the award of their badges. We are really proud of our students (and staff) in the way they nurture our students, fostering and galvanising their talents and wider interests.

Over the course of this term there have been 84 students nominated and presented with the E Pluribus Unum Award for living the school's values. They have demonstrated Kindness, Respect or Ambition in many different ways and nothing makes us prouder than hearing the stories that accompany the nominations. Well done!

Year 11 have nearly completed their coursework in school. As we leave this term, their final full one in school, we would like to wish them all the very best of luck as they move towards the GCSE examinations starting in early May, with the speaking exams in Spanish and Art exams in the weeks leading up to May. Year 10 begin their Practice Examinations as we return after Easter, followed not long after by Work Experience. Of course, we urge all of them to work hard and revise in preparation for the exams, but we also look forward, with Year 11 to a range of traditional valedictory activities at the end of the examination series.

We were delighted to receive the names of the Year 6 students who selected BPA for their high school for September 2025 – the Class of 2030. For the fourth year in a row, we have hit our admission number of 154 and have a wait and appeals list. Testament to the school's improvement, we are both humbled and proud by the choices made by families in our community. The transition of information between primary and secondary school is well underway and genuinely, we cannot wait to meet the newest members of the school family.

HAF Programme

The HAF programme, led by Lancashire County Council and West Lancashire Sports Partnership is running over the Easter period.
