Parents Evening Feedback

Our most recent parents evening was for our Year 10 students in June. We would like to thank all Year 10 parents who contributed valuable feedback through the parent questionnaire. There were 108 forms returned from families in the school and this represents a good indicator of parental views. We are thankful to you for your positive feedback and your comments on how the school can seek to improve further; a good school is one that listens and responds and we know this is something we needed to improve and is an area we will continue to constantly review and evolve.

The overall summary of the feedback we received from Year 10 parents is detailed in this table of statistics. We are delighted with this overall picture but we also take very seriously your suggestions for further improvement.

We also asked you for individual comments on what you feel has improved about the school since September.

The main areas of improvements were identified as:

- Communication
- Leadership
- Class charts
- Behaviour and discipline in and out of school
- Lunch management
- Confidence of students
- Atmosphere within the school
- Well informed of progress and engagement





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The questionnaire also reflected some individual parental suggestions on how the school can continue to develop to meet the needs of the students and families in the local community.

The main areas of suggested improvements still required were identified as:

- Supply teachers (we are now fully staffed in September)
- Quality of teaching
- Consistency of behaviour/achievement points
- Communication
- Management of lunchtimes
- Lack of facilities and clubs

All of the above are areas we will continue to work hard to improve even further.


Sadly at the end of term we also bid our fond farewells to staff who are moving on. This time around we say goodbye to:
