The following plan can be adapted for all text types in the exam (except leaflet)

<p>Paragraph 1 Introduction of ideas</p> <p><i>Article will need a headline</i></p>	<p>Controversial statement linked to topic – be bold, but appropriate</p> <p>Use a ‘subject-adjective pair-‘as a 1 sentence paragraph e.g. <b>‘Male Footballers – overpaid and overopinionated – get paid far too much attention from the media.’</b></p> <p>Write an ‘Imagine 3 examples:’ sentence for your introduction.  e.g. <b>Imagine a world where all genders recognised for their contribution to sport, where we celebrate all talent, where pay in sport is equal: this is the world we should be living in.</b></p>
<p>Paragraph 2: Developing ideas / argument</p> <p><i>Article will need a sub-heading</i></p> <p><i>Speech will need direct address / imperatives</i></p>	<p>Link your argument to a big idea – choose from the list</p> <div data-bbox="1066 831 1458 1070" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Gender equality</li> <li>• Race</li> <li>• Education</li> <li>• Age</li> <li>• Money</li> </ul> </div> <p>Use an <b>‘adjective phrase’</b> as your topic sentence (this is a subordinate clause)  e.g. <b>‘An unequal sport,</b> football has for too long ignored the talents of women.’</p> <p><b>Include anaphora</b> – repeat the same phrase <b>three times in three separate sentences.</b></p> <p>e.g. <b>Innate sexism has meant</b> that female footballers have been overshadowed for decades. <b>Innate sexism</b> has meant that women have been discouraged from the sport. <b>Innate sexism</b> must end in order for all genders to enjoy and excel in the game of football.</p>
<p>Paragraph 3: Acknowledging the opposite view.</p> <p><i>Article will need a subheading</i></p> <p><i>Speech will need direct address / rhetorical questions</i></p>	<p>Link your argument to a big idea</p> <div data-bbox="1070 1473 1465 1713" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Gender equity</li> <li>• Race</li> <li>• Education</li> <li>• Age</li> <li>• Money</li> </ul> </div> <p>Use a ‘conjunction start’ for your topic sentence e.g. <b>‘Despite the obvious inequalities,</b> many believe that only football played by men has any value.’</p> <p>Then explain why people might hold the opposite view to you – <b>two sentences</b> <b>e.g.</b> ‘I acknowledge that,,,’ Unfortunately, it is also the case...’</p> <div data-bbox="1086 1787 1453 1989" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p><b>Try to include an anecdote</b> – give an example of your point in action.</p> <p><b>‘In my experience...’</b></p> </div> <p>End with a <b>countering of the counter argument:</b> e.g. ‘Nonetheless, it is clear...’ ‘However, when this view is scrutinised...’</p>

<p>Paragraph 4:</p> <p>Conclusion – this needs to be your strongest argument.</p>	<p>Link your argument to a big idea</p> <p><b>Topic sentence: ‘description: details’</b>  e.g.  Inequality in football is <b>everywhere: we</b> must take a stand against it.’</p> <p><b>Introduce your strongest argument:</b>  e.g.  ‘The most compelling reason...’  ‘Without doubt...’  Ultimately, it is my firm belief...</p> <p><b>End with an ‘If, if, if sentence’ rewording your ‘Imagine 3 examples:’</b></p> <p>e.g.  If we lived in a world where all genders in sport were recognised, if all sportspeople were paid equally, where all talents were celebrated, then we might just be creating a better world for future generations.</p> <div data-bbox="1091 311 1453 568" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p><b>Include a shocking statistic –</b> but make it realistic and name the source!</p> <p><b>‘According the FA, only 25% of female footballers earn a living wage.</b></p> </div>
