

Gender is...

- ...a social construction relating to behaviours and attributes based on labels of masculinity and femininity.
- Gender identity is a personal, internal perception of oneself and so the gender category someone identifies with may not match the sex they were assigned at birth.
- ...where an individual may see themselves as a man, a
 woman, as having no gender, or as having a non-binary
 gender where people identify as somewhere on a spectrum
 between man and woman



What are the main points of the Equality Act 2010?

The Act makes it unlawful to discriminate against someone on the grounds of any of these characteristics: age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage or civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion/belief, sex (gender) and sexual orientation. These are often referred to as protected characteristics.








What is a pronoun?

A pronoun is a word that is used instead of a **noun or noun phrase**. There are various pronouns that can be used to describe a person, including he / him / she / her / we / they / them...


