





Ventilation




ClassCharts




- Parents can access information on their child via an online platform called ClassCharts





Homework


Meaningful homework in order to reinforce learning and promote independence which is:

- Purposeful and meaningful
- Includes a wide range of activities reading, preparation and consolidation; knowledge and skills based
- Reading, Revision or Recall
- Set on ClassCharts



How can I help my child with their learning?

- Talk to them about their learning they need to do at home
- Reinforce the importance of spacing out self study and not to cram
- Check work set on ClassCharts
- Encourage work to be done in an area without distractions
- Encourage self study even if no homework has been set summarise, self test, review

1. Focused 5 Curriculum Days throughout the year

Statutory Elements:

- Relationships & Sex Education
- Prevent Agenda

2. Daily planned programme within tutor time

- Relevant and real for the student
- What is happening in the world and what effects students directly?
- Find answers to questions that they may find difficult to be answered
