
ClassCharts



KS3 Curriculum

Core subjects

English, Maths, Science, Spanish, PE, History, Geography,

Option A = 6 lessons





How can I help my child with their learning?

- Ask them about their day (and their learning!)
- Check work set on ClassCharts
- Encourage work to be done in an area without distractions if possible, or to attend homework club
- Encourage them to try to retrieve information and test
 themselves





Homework

Meaningful homework in order to reinforce learning and promote independence which is:

- Purposeful and meaningful
- Includes a wide range of activities reading, preparation and consolidation;
 knowledge and skills based
- Reading, Revision or Recall
- Set on ClassCharts



Learning at home – Top tips

- Start making habits early
- Little and often 20 30 minute bursts
- Plan a home learning timetable
- Create revision resources at the end of each topic
- Revisit teachers to recap on misconceptions
- Revision books and materials: link on website





How can I help my child with their Reading?

- Ask them what they are reading and what they like about it
- Encourage them to visit the school library
- Check what they are reading is age appropriate
- Read to them/with them
- Read what they are reading
