Mrs Riley (Class Teacher)

This is my third year in Year 1 at Burscough Village; prior to this I have taught both Reception and Year 1 at other schools. I am a music specialist and will be running the school the choir and concerts throughout the year – watch out for our Nativity extravaganza! Over the summer, I have created a wonderful setting with fantastic resources that will enable the children to learn, develop independence and resilience and most importantly, have fun! I am extremely excited for the year ahead.

Important Information for Year 1

PE Days

Year 1 pupils will have PE on Monday and Friday afternoons.

Pupils should bring their full PE kit and trainers (please see school website for details) at the start of term and leave it in their locker until the end of the half-term.

If at any point PE kits need to go home for cleaning/after-school PE club etc., please ensure that they return to school the next day.

Homework

Homework is a valuable way of enhancing your child's learning outside of the classroom as well as helping them to develop their independence and organisational skills.

Year 1 pupils will receive the following homework:

<u>Reading</u> – Pupils will change their books every **Friday**. They will receive a **Monster Phonics book** – This is for them to read aloud at home to an adult – this book will be at the children's phonics level and should be read 3 times.

They will also receive a **colour banded book** – this is a shared reading book. There may be words or sounds the children are not familiar with and therefore should be read together.

Lastly they will choose a **library book** – This is for children to enjoy story time at home.

<u>Maths</u> – Each week, we will focus on a different Y1 maths key skill and send home possible activities to support this. The children will receive a maths folder to keep their homework in. Homework will be sent out **Friday** and returned the following **Wednesday**.

Spellings – Every **Friday** children will receive spellings which they will have to learn ready for a test the following **Friday**. Please practise at home with your child. Alongside this, pupils will work on these spellings during our phonics lessons and when accessing independent learning challenges. **Spelling tests will begin once we feel that the children are ready.**
