

# **Important Information for Year 5**

## **PE Days**

Year 5 pupils will have PE on **Tuesday and Friday.** 

Pupils should bring their full PE kit and trainers (please see school website for details) at the start of term and leave it in their locker until the end of the half-term.

If at any point PE kits need to go home for cleaning/after-school PE club etc., please ensure that they return to school the next day.

Year 5 are scheduled to go swimming after the Easter break this year.

# **Guitar**

Year 5 will have whole class guitars every Wednesday for the first term (up until Christmas). Children will be issued with a guitar which they are to take to and from school. It is extremely important that the children look after and bring their guitar to school each week.

## **Homework**

Homework is a valuable way of enhancing your child's learning outside of the classroom as well as helping them to develop their independence and organisational skills.

Year 5 pupils will receive the following homework:

<u>Maths & English</u> - Children will be receiving English **and** Maths homework per week. Each half term, homework will be given out in a folder. What to complete each week is indicated by the date on the top of each piece of work. Children are to bring their homework files into school with them each Monday to hand in the relevant piece of work.

<u>Spellings</u> – Every **Monday** children will receive 10 spellings which they will have to learn ready for a test the following **Monday**. Children are to look after these spellings each week by keeping them in their homework folder.

**Reading** – Reading really does support the children with so much of their learning. Because of this, pupils should try to read as frequently as possible. They will have some opportunity to read the books they have chosen from the library/school reading scheme during the school day but children should aim to read a minimum 3 times a week at home. Any reading is to be recorded in their reading diary by the pupils themselves or an adult at home. Children should **always** have their reading book and diary in school with them **every day**. Once a pupil has finished a book, they are to select a new one, there will be opportunity to do this at the beginning of each day. I will collect in reading diaries each week to monitor reading.

Having taught the children for most of Year 4, I am excited that I get another WHOLE year with the class. I was astounded by academic and personal progress that all pupils achieved last year and I know that Year 5 is going to as successful (if not more) ...
