Curriculum Intent

Our curriculum is built and designed to enable our children to "Strive for the Future".

Our aim is to develop:

Our continual curriculum development is not only designed to ensure coverage and progression, its foundation is routed from the childrens' own interests, provides children with memorable experiences, engenders a sense of personal pride in achievement and gives a purpose and relevance for learning. WOW starters are used as a starting point to engage interest and create motivated and enthusiastic learners. Our children are encouraged to have a voice and have regular opportunities to contribute towards their learning and are involved in decision making that effects the whole school through assessing prior knowledge and skills at the beginning of each topic, our strong pupil council, subject ambassadors and regular pupil interviews.

We want our children to work hard to achieve success; being focussed on the task in hand; tackling it conscientiously and diligently; having the resilience, tenacity and grit to keep going when others may start to give up. High expectations in speech, communication and listening skills strengthen the children's ability to learn and also gives them the skills to resolve conflict and act cooperatively as a team player.

Our academic curriculum is broad, balanced and ambitious but also allows the children to develop a range of life skills and prepare them for a life beyond primary school, future employment, training, volunteering or to further learn new skills.

Our extensive beautiful outdoor environment provides an opportunity for active learning for all our children. The school grounds have been developed so they can enrich different curriculum areas. We are committed to ensuring that all learners access excellent educational experiences that embraces learning beyond the classroom walls, and learning outside the classroom and beyond is integrated into the curriculum.

In recognising the development of the whole child, pastoral support is important so everyone can access the curriculum equally. Various programmes of support are provided for children where a need has been identified. We work hard to work collaboratively with our families to enhance our pupils learning experiences in school and to support their own child's learning at home. A varied timetable for extra-curricular activities is offered, with clubs that support the core curriculum, as well as those which develop specialist skills, such as Jujitsu, whilst also extending the range of children's experiences. Educational visits and visitors are a key feature of the curriculum; our fabulous PTFA subsidises a range of these to enrich the curriculum for all.
