This year our SATs results are something to be proud of. 100% of are pupils are working at the expected level in writing, maths and grammar, spelling and punctuation and 82% in reading which is way higher than the national average. We also have a high number of children working at greater depth within the national standard. The progress that the children have made is probably the most important and all children have made great progress from their Key stage 1 SATS. This is testament to all the hard work and determination of the pupils and staff and the support of the parents. What makes me even prouder of this fantastic achievement is that our broard and rich curriculum has not been compromised in any way to achieve this. Children will never reach their full potential unless they enjoy learning. At Burton Agnes we strive to get the balance right, teaching skills for life through stimulating and memorable activities.
