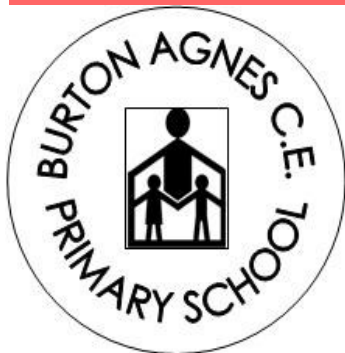

For three days the children were challenged to step out of their comfort zone and take part in daring feats they never thought they would be able to do. Every pupil tried something new with enthusiasm and bravery and it was lovely to see them all so proud of their individual achievements. Whether they were soaked by jumping in the lake or falling off their raft, or drenched by the constant rain on Wednesday morning, the children took to the water, the woods and the high ropes with a cheerfulness and resilience that made them fantastic ambassadors for Burton Agnes School. There were physical challenges, such as building and sailing their own rafts, climbing high ropes and constructing dens. But there were also activities designed to make them think, such as problem solving and a scavenger hunt with clues to work out. Perhaps the greatest challenge the children faced was putting on their own sheets and duvet covers, so their beds could be slept in. The greatest challenge faced by the adults (at least on the first night) was getting the children to actually stay in those beds and fall asleep before midnight!!!!

Mrs Loggie and Mrs Young, and myself, who accompanied Class 4 on their trip, were more than proud of the way the children displayed our school values, both in the way they cared for each other and happily took on duties around the centre, but also in the way they encouraged children from other schools to join in their games and to feel welcome in the Burton Agnes family. We all returned to school on Wednesday afternoon, soggy, tired and happy, but most of all, with an amazing sense of accomplishment.
