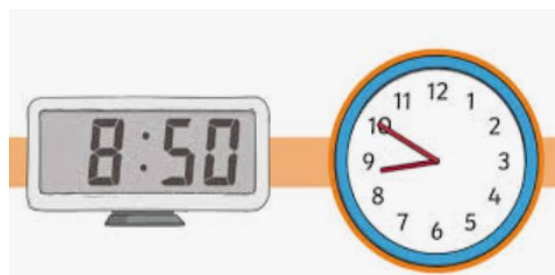


Air Up Bottles
