A note from Mrs. Jameson

I hope this newsletter finds everyone in our Burton Agnes Family, whether they are at home or at school, healthy and well.

This week we welcomed back to school our Year 6 pupils. Mrs Kemp and the staff supporting the Year 6 bubble have been very pleased with the way the children have come back to school and have followed the guidelines that we have in place to help



healthy and safe.

I am immensely proud of all of the children in school regarding how well they have adapted to the changes that are currently running in place and I am

ever grateful to the staff and you as parents for supporting this both at home and in school.

Now that lockdown is starting to ease a little we still need to be mindful of our actions. Whilst the government are starting to ease the 2 m restrictions from 4th of July as a school we are still following the 2m guidelines as recommended by the Local authority to ensure safety of all. We continue to ask parents that if they are sending their children to school that they follow this guidance at home in order to keep our pupils, staff and families as safe as we possibly can.

With the year 6 pupils back in school, drop off and collections have become a little busier. Please can we ask that you do not arrive too early for your bubble to go in. We currently have children lining up before their bubble is due to go in which is causing congestion problems. We have put out some new markings on the pavement if you are parking down the hill past the bus space so that you don't have to walk past the other line, allowing for social distancing.

If you have passed the time for your bubble to go in, please can you join the back of the queue. If there is an exceptional occasion when, due to unforeseen circumstances, a parent is late for drop-off, parents will need to wait in a socially distanced queue at the main school entrance door until a member of staff is available to receive a child and escort them to their classroom base. If a parent is late at the end of the school day, children will be taken back to their group 'bubble' classroom base. Parents will then need to wait in a socially distanced queue at the main school entrance door until a member of staff is able to escort a child from their classroom to the school entrance.

Keeping in touch

This week and last Mrs Grainger, Mrs Kemp and I have been getting in touch with families who still have children at home. It has been lovely to hear how you are all doing and to chat to the children and hear all of their news. If we have not been able to get hold of you yet we will keep trying!
