STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths).

Barry challenged the children to make Egyptian Shadufs, but it wasn't as simple as that. They needed to work in teams and first build a structure that would stand and was strong enough to hold two cups of water. The children needed to use maths to ensure that the sting was the perfect length to ensure the shaduf would do the job it needed to do. Patience, trial and error and skills of evaluation were called upon to get this piece of engineering to extract and transport water.
