

## **A note from Mrs. Jameson**

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I hope this newsletter continues to find everyone in our Burton Agnes Family, whether they are at home or at school, healthy and well.

You will have all seen in the news this week that it is the governments ambition to get all pupils back to school in September, which is great news. There is nothing we want more to have all pupils return to school . The 58 paged guidance document arrived yesterday and we are now busy trying to make sense of it all. As soon as we have a clear plan in place we will share it with you, although the government will not actually confirm these arrangement until mid August.

As we think about re-opening fully, our collective mind-set is really important. There is a great deal of unhelpful hype in the media at the moment saying that children will have forgotten all of their learning and it will impact on them in later years. The reality is that that a young persons school career is typically 468 weeks long. The time they have missed represents 3% of this. This is not something that we have chosen and when we return in September we will assess the children's needs and plan for this. I think the media is forgetting all of the fabulous work you will have done with your children, all that additional family contact, the nurturing and the new skills they might have learnt such as baking, sewing, woodwork etc. As always here at Burton Agnes we will remain calm and measured and plan accordingly.

## **School Reports.**

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During the course of next week will be sending out the annual reports for your child. For those children who are in school ,we will send your report home on Friday and we will send siblings reports home with them too. For everyone else, we will post them out. Please be patient as Royal Mail is taking a little longer than normal at present. The reports will look the same as they always do however we are only able to report on the learning that took place in school up until lockdown. Because of this, this year we will not be putting on an attainment or academic grade but we have included an effort grade. This is because we can't measure against age related expectations as they have not completed the years work. We will included predicted grades for the year 6 Sat's based on the practise that that they did after Christmas. When the children return to school in September we will carefully assess where they are and plan to meet their needs from that point. If you would like to discuss your child's report further please contact school to arrange a telephone call with your child's class teacher.

## Roman Take Over


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The children in the Key worker bubble have been learning about Romans and became a Roman soldier for the day.


