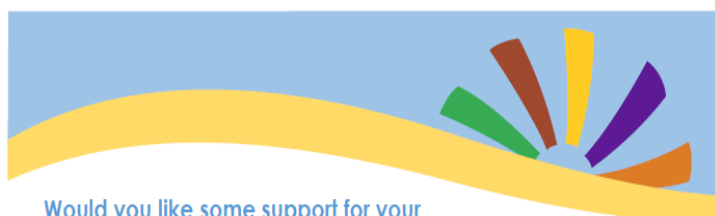


Cross Country Success
