A Note from Mrs. Jameson




School has been alive with learning this week as children are becoming absorbed in our new learning for this term built around the whole school theme of 'Beyond My Window.'



Hooked on Books

- Have excellent phonic knowledge and skills
- Have knowledge of an extensive and rich vocabulary
- Have an excellent comprehension of texts, understanding what they are reading.
- Develop their knowledge through having read a range of rich and varied texts.

The children are reading *The Nowhere Emporium* by Ross McKenzie, a story all about using your imagination.
