Our girls' cricket team beat the Shrewsbury School in the County tournament, gaining first place. Not only that, they also won the indoor cricket tournament with their excellent skills! Successes don't stop there however. Our year 7 football team are through to their third final this year and one of our students, Emily Fletcher, has been selected to play for England's U15 football team in Belgium over the holidays! Incredible accomplishments for so many of our young people – well done!

Our Maths team did a brilliant job for Maths week, including running competitions for the best pie for Pi Day and a number of our students also tested their memory skills by reciting Pi. The top student was able to recite Pi to one hundred decimal places! Wow! Not only that, our Year 10 students came third in the Maths Feast competition against schools in Telford and Wrekin.

Finally, it has been a very exciting month for Mr Morgan and me as we were asked to deliver keynote speeches and share good practice at various events including the Optimus Education Conference, SecEd Conference and the House of Commons (the photo above right is me at the House of Commons with a cup of tea!). School takes a national lead on mental health

A SCHOOL in Newport has become one of the first in the country to commit to tackling mental health under a new Public Health England campaign.

Burton Borough School signed the Prevention Concordat for Better Mental Health, which marks the first time agencies across the community and care sectors have come together to make prevention a priority for mental health.

School included creating a school structure that supported the mental health and wellbeing needs of both staff and students as well as the extensive work the school does with many external agencies.

Christine Raymont-Hall, principal, said: "We are delighted to be recognised by Public Health England as making significant steps towards promoting good mental health and preventing mental health problems."

"Mental health is at the top of our agenda. We will continue to share what we do with other schools and organisations so that we can do our bit to help raise awareness of the importance of good mental health."

Lily Makurash, national lead for public mental health at Public Health England, said: "We're delighted that Burton Borough School has joined the growing list of organisations signing up to our Prevention Concordat for Better Mental Health. Through local and national action we can all contribute to improving mental health."

A group of young cricketers have been raising money for a charity in South Africa ahead of a tour of the country.

They have arrived in South Africa for a 12-day tour which will see them play six games against local opposition.

Before the trip, the group of under-15s raised around £3,000 for Sport4Kids, and took with them eight kit bags of cricket clothing together with football kit.

One of the tour organisers Wendy McDonald said: "The Sportskids and have collected a mountain of donated sports kit to donate."

"They have climbed Snowdon, walked the Hadrian's Wall coast to coast path, canoed the River Severn, swam across Coniston Water and climbed The Old Man of Conistone."

"They did a 5km mud run and two fabulous quiz nights rounded off a fantastic fundraising effort."

Both Clarke and Barnard donated an autographed Worcestershire shirt and sweater to help raise funds for the tour.
