Now do some research and write up the most significant ideas you learned that affect the way you think about the question, then explain why they are so significant. Use the BBS method:

Because 1:

State what the first important idea was that you found out to support your ideas.

Because 2:

State the second important idea you found out.

But:

Try to include at least one point that goes against your others, a counterargument.

Explain the idea, explore why it is important, the implications of it. Perhaps give examples to help your reader understand.

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So: Summarise your research and explain your final thought(s) about the question here.

Do you feel the same as you did before your research? Are you even more strongly on one side? If so, what was the new information that convinced you?

Did you change your mind? If so, what was the main finding that influenced you?
