## Proud at BBS Message from our Principal

### Dear families,

This week, I am incredibly proud to reflect on our collective act of **remembrance**, which brought our **school** and our **wider community** together in a series of **meaningful** and **poignant** events.

On Remembrance Sunday, Eden Clifford and Lucas Curbishley represented our school with great respect, laying a wreath at St. Nicholas Church to honour those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in service to our country. On Monday, Jess Berry and Maisie Jones stood with dignity, holding the flags at the cemetery service, ensuring that showed our care and respect in these moments of reflection.

At 11 o'clock on Monday, our entire school community stood in silence for two minutes. This simple yet powerful act allowed us to pause and remember the sacrifices made by our armed forces, and to reflect on the freedoms we enjoy today thanks to their courage and commitment.

That evening, we were privileged to host a special community remembrance event alongside Newport Junior School, the Newport Male Voice Choir, and the Royal British Legion. 

We are incredibly **proud** of our students for their **respectfulness**, and how well they have **engaged** with our **local community** throughout this week of **remembrance**.

On Sunday 10th November, two of our platinum year 11 students - Eden Clifford and Lucas Curbishley (pictured below) laid a wreath at the remembrance service at the Newport Cenotaph. Both students were accompanied by Mrs Bedford and Mrs Heins, along with members of our local community. Counsellor Tim Nelson contacted our school after the event to congratulate our students...

The students who placed a wreath yesterday at Newport's memorial to those who fought and died in the Worlds wars, conducted themselves admirably. They were a credit to the school. Please pass on my praise and thanks, which was echoed by other Councillors around me.





On Monday 11th November, our school fell silent at 11am. This year, our act of remembrance took the format of a video that featured Mrs Bedford reading 'The Exhortation' and 'The Kohima Epitaph' along with a muscial performance by our very own Mr Williams who played 'The Last Post' before, and 'The Reveille' after, the two minute silence. This video was a poignant tribute to those who sacrificed, and continue to sacrifice, their lives.




## Proud at BBS Phouse Remembrance



Years 7, 8, 9 have submitted their History homework projects this week. Students could choose from one of three activities:


- Meanwhile elsewhere what is going on around the world beyond the topics covered in the curriculum

## Year 7 Fruity Flapjacks

Year 7 have been making fruity flapjacks this week in their food lessons. Well done year 7 - it looks delicious!

### **RECIPE**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

75g dried fruit

**250g** oats

**125g** sugar

125g butter

2 x 15ml spoons of golden syrup

#### **EQUIPMENT:**

1 Weighing Scales

1 Knife

1 Green Chopping Board

1 Measuring Spoons

1 Wooden Spoon

Fancy giving our recipe a go at home? Send us photos of your fruity flapjacks to feature in our next family bulletin!

### **HOW TO MAKE:**

1. Preheat the oven to 180oC/gas mark 4

2. Chop the **dried fruit** into small pieces

3. Place the **fat**, **sugar**, and **syrup** into a saucepan and gently heat until the fat has melted

4. Stir in the oats and dried fruit

5. Pour the mixture into a **non-stick (or lined) baking tray**.

6. Pat down the mixture in the baking tin.

7. Bake for 15-20 mins, until lightly browned.

8. Remove from the oven and **cut into 'bars'** in the baking tin while hot.



Vary the type of dried fruit used, e.g. sultanas, figs, mixed fruit.

Add 1x 15ml spoon cinnamon, ginger or mixed spice to the oat mixture

Go for grated fresh apple or carrot
The baking tin gets hot so remember to use oven gloves.

### Gas mark 5/180 Degrees

1. Grease and line your tin.

2. Whisk all ingredients together until soft and creamy. Add flavourings.

3. Pour cake mixture in your tin.

4. Bake for 10-15 mins until golden. Leave to cool then decorate.




