Year 7 Making Pasta Salad

Year 7 have been making pasta salad this week in their food lessons. Well done year 7 - it looks delicious!

RECIPE

INGREDIENTS:

100g penne pasta

2tbs pesto or mayo

Cherry tomatoes

50g cheddar

Half sweet pepper

EQUIPMENT:

1 Bowl

1 Knife & 1 Peeler

1 Green Chopping Board

1 Saucepan

1 Table Spoon

HOW TO MAKE:

- 1. Put a pan of cold water on to **boil**, enough water to cover the pasta.
- 2. Using the knife, slice the **tomatoes** in half and place in a bowl.
- 3. Dice your **pepper** and add to your **tomatoes**.
- 4. Once your **pasta** is cooked, firm to bit but not starchy, drain in a colander and cool quickly with lots of cold water. Once cool add to your **peppers**.
- 6. Stir in your **pesto** or **mayo** and serve.



Year 7 Healthy Eating



How can our parents encourage healthy eating?

- 1.Include fruit and vegetables in every meal and add to pasta sauces.
- 2. Serve fruit and vegetables as snacks.
- 3. Keep a stock of **healthy snacks** to offer when children are hungry e.g. after school.
- 4. Limit the amount of sweets and sugary snacks/drinks.
- 5. Provide water or milk with meals and snacks.
- 6. Serve small portions to prevent overeating.
- 7. Avoid using sweets treats as rewards for eating all their main course.
- 8. Encourage children to **help prepare dishes** e.g. putting their own toppings on homemade pizza
- 9.Set a **good example**.
- 10. Encourage family meals together.
- 11. Avoid snaking in between meals.
- 12.Parents to follow the **Eatwell guide**.
- 13. Serve savoury foods first.

Year 7 have been experimenting with Tie-Dye during textiles this week. Let's see how they got in...









