What worked for our students

Maisie used an app on her phone to organise her revision time. She improved by an average of 1.5 grades per subject between the end of Y10 and Y11

Imogen completed 50 past papers over 2 years in Maths and got a grade 5 by 1 mark!

Sam did a past paper per week in Maths and English (About 25 each subject in total). Sam has just been accepted onto a course studying History at the Emmanuel College Cambridge University

Leoni was on grade 4's in Maths, English, and Science after her Y10 Mock exams. She got 7's and 8's in all 3 subjects. She said she realised she needed to just knuckle down and treat every lesson like it was an opportunity to improve every grade

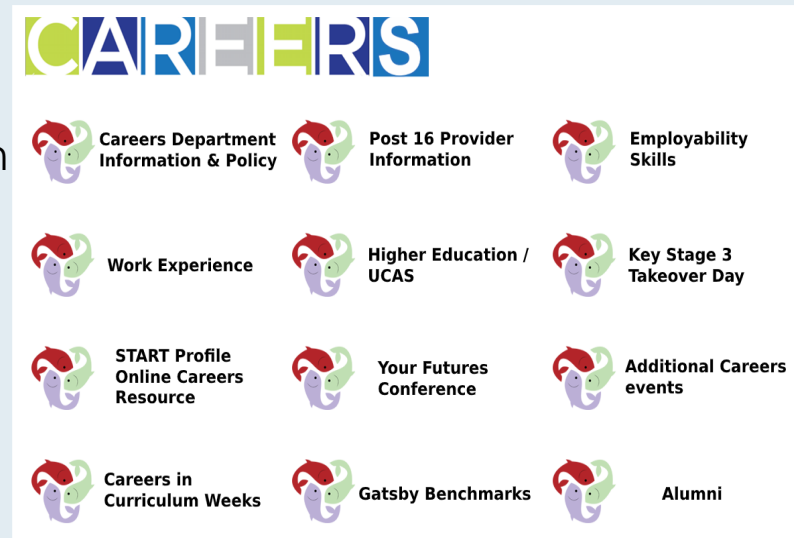
- Sixth Form & College courses fill up fast so get in early!

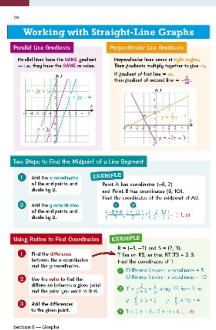
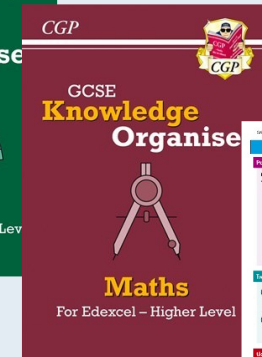
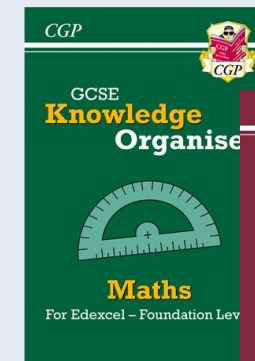
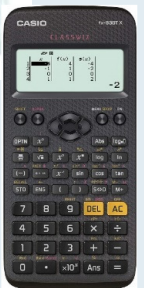
- Lessons

- Regular topic and mixed assessments, and mock papers periodically
- HegartyMaths homework – current topics & recall
 - Note taking and self-marking critical

ENGLISH DEPARTMENT



Overview

Two exams for English Literature and two for English Language – no coursework.

We need to continue to: build stamina; resilience; an ability to manage time; and have an acute understanding of the skills being tested for each question.

Many of the Department examine for the examinations.



The Exams ...

English Language:

Questions get progressively more difficult;

Tests reading – selection of evidence; analysis of language and structure; inference; comparison; evaluation

Tests writing skills – creative and discursive – structured, engaging, vocabulary and language use.
Note: 20% of this examination is for spelling, punctuation, use of sentence types and use of accurate grammar.

English Literature:

Closed-book exams

Shakespeare – Macbeth. Pre-1900 texts – Jekyll & Hyde or A Christmas Carol. Play – An Inspector Calls. Students can't expect to have read these texts once to gain a pass. They should be re-reading texts and watching different versions regularly.



How to Boost Your Chances

Access past papers from class teachers and practice;

Complete all work to your best ability;

Pay close attention to accuracy and proofread;

Know set texts in-depth and access the wider reading – QR codes on every English door. This gives different ways of interpreting.

Access revision podcasts;

Intervention students – access everything offered.

Access Seneca/Massolit. Do not watch Mr Bruff for English Language – he is inaccurate.



How can you support your child?

Homework – please encourage your child to be diligent;

Keep in touch with your child's class teacher;

Discuss careers and aspirations – English Language GCSE is often needed for career progression in later life as well as getting onto post-16 courses.

Podcasts for the different questions for Language – revision can be accessed when it suits the student – flexibility/unable to attend

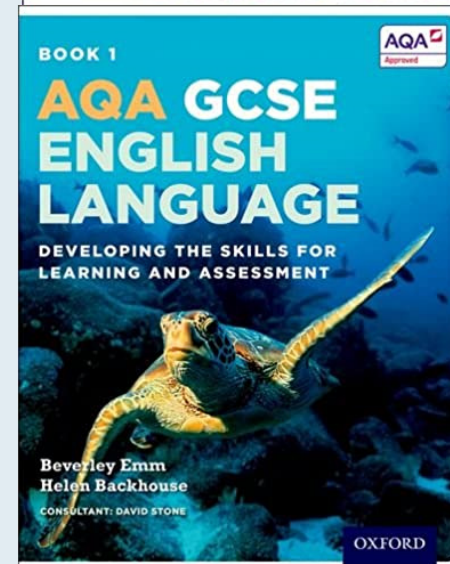
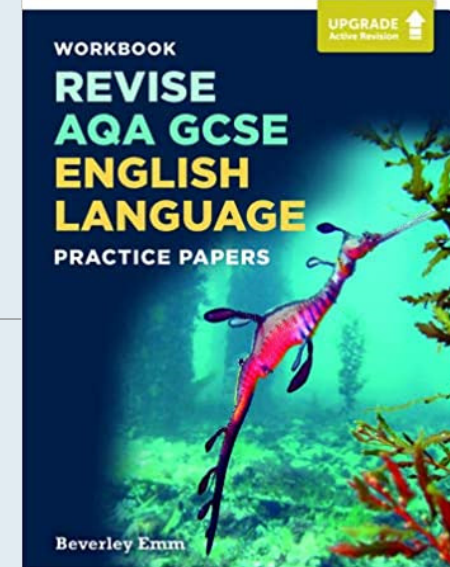
Intervention group for targeted revision/borderline students to be set up very soon. Your collaboration to encourage independent study/accessing all intervention offered is crucial.

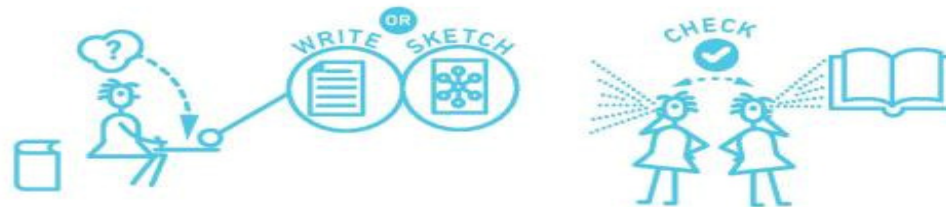

HOW TO DO IT

Put away your class materials, and write or sketch everything you know. Be as thorough as possible. Then, check your class materials for accuracy and important points you missed.



Take as many practice tests as you can get your hands on. If you don't have ready-made tests, try making your own and trading with a friend who has done the same.



You can also make flashcards. Just make sure you practice recalling the information on them, and go beyond definitions by thinking of links between ideas.
