Time flies - it has already been 2 years since we joined together with Great Sankey High School, Park Road Primary, Chapelford Village Primary and Westbrook Old Hall Primary to create Omega MAT! Our aim was for the MAT to be a protective 'umbrella' with an overall vision for the best possible school experience from 4 to 19 for every child, supporting each school but allowing us to keep our own unique ethos and identity. So, how have we done so far?

We have improved transition between primary and secondary phases, with extra transition days, and collaboration between colleagues so that there is better continuity for children and they are given the right level of challenge. Teachers have taken part in high quality training. There are MAT sport, athletics and dance opportunities. We have taken part in an extended MAT writing project to improve teaching and learning, and we have a children's author, Curtis Jobling, as our patron to promote reading. We have an executive MAT school council with children representing every school meeting each half term. From a financial viewpoint, at a time when many schools nationally are struggling financially, the MAT has a healthy budget and is able to tap into additional funding opportunities, such as the grant which enabled us to replace our windows and doors.
