



Pupil Premium

Burtonwood Community Primary became an academy on 1st January 2018. This report covers the period from 1st September 2018 up to 31st August 2019.

In these twelve months the school received £44, 880 as their pupil premium. This money was spent in the following ways to provide additional support and guidance for pupils on free school meals (FSM) or in care.

The children are given a scaled score from their end of KS2 assessments in reading, grammar and Maths. To achieve the expected standard, the child needs a scaled score of 100.

Overall attainment and progress this year has improved from 2018 and has benefitted from the additional teaching support in Year 6.

Attainment from Year 3 – Year 5

Due to the small number of Pupil Premium pupils in each of these classes, the attainment data below combines the three year groups.

The school will receive £36,960 in this financial year for children on FSM. As the above strategies have been successful in closing the gap in attainment, the school plans to continue with the following support to FSM pupils.

- 1:1 tuition for KS2 children delivered by teachers either before or after school
- Additional teaching assistant support in KS1 and 2
- Every Child a Reader intervention programme for Year 1
- Additional teacher support targeted at Year 2 and 6
- Extra-curricular activities including music lessons, trips, residential and after-school clubs

These strategies ensure that children in receipt of Pupil Premium:

- **Have the basic skills needed to make good progress**
- **Have additional support with their learning to consolidate and move forward their learning**
- **Have access to all learning opportunities**

The impact of the pupil premium will be monitored throughout the year as part of the school's monitoring processes.
