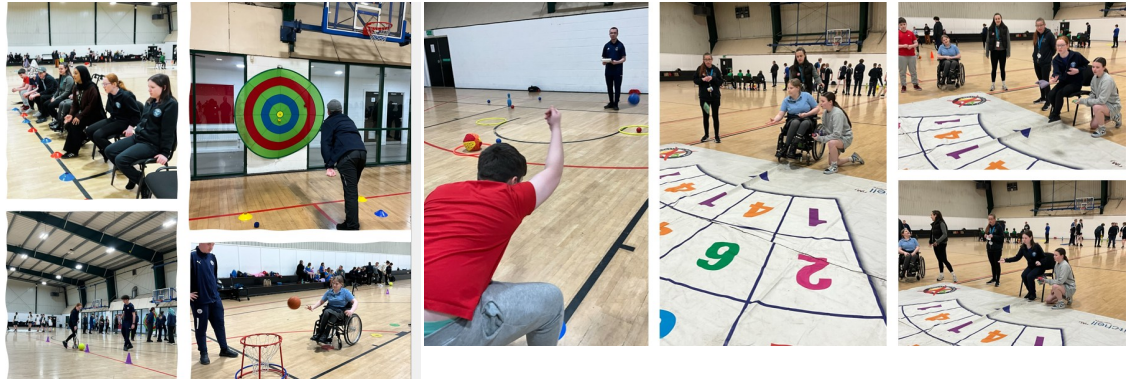

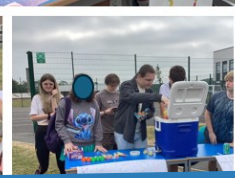


Enterprise Day Success!

As part of planning, sourcing and making meals independently in food technology, students went off site to buy the ingredients for the meals students planned to cook

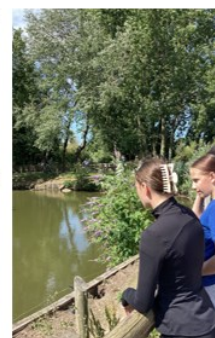


Group GS recently visited the Manchester Museum

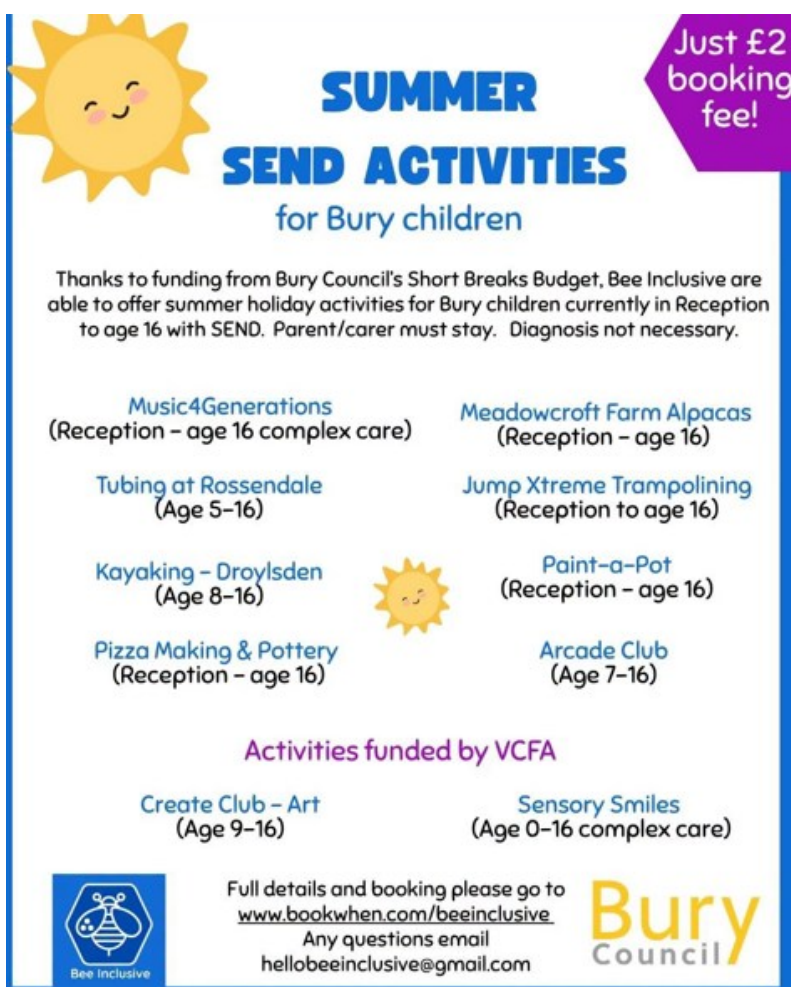
