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1. Aims

Caistor Yarborough Academy is committed to providing a fully accessible environment which values and includes all pupils, staff, parents, and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional, or cultural needs.

The purpose of this plan is to demonstrate how the Academy intends to:

- Increase the extent to which disabled students can participate in the curriculum
- Improve the physical environment of the Academy to enable disabled students to take better advantage of education, benefits, facilities, and services provided
- Improve the availability of accessible information to disabled students

2. Legislation and Guidance

This document meets the requirements of Schedule 10 of the Equality Act 2010 and the Department for Education (DfE) guidance for academies. It also supports compliance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018, ensuring that all online information meets the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.2 at AA standard.

4. Digital Accessibility and Compliance

Caistor Yarborough Academy recognises its responsibility to ensure that all digital information, including the Academy website and online documents, meets accessibility standards under the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

The Academy is committed to ensuring its online content conforms to the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.2 at AA standard. Annual audits of the website are conducted using a combination of automated testing tools and manual checks.

An Accessibility Statement is published on the Academy website, outlining compliance levels, known issues, and steps for improvement. Users who experience difficulty accessing information can report issues via the website contact form or by emailing the main office.

Currently, no parts of the Academy's digital services are considered a disproportionate burden under the Accessibility Regulations. This plan will be reviewed annually to maintain compliance.

5. Monitoring Arrangements

This plan will be reviewed every three years, or sooner if required, and approved by the Governing Body. Progress towards objectives will be monitored annually as part of the Academy's equality and inclusion review cycle.
