This summary outlines how **Caistor Yarborough Academy** delivers music education across **three key areas**: **curriculum music, co-curricular provision, and musical experiences**. It also includes plans for future development and partnerships supporting the school's music provision.

Plan A: Curriculum Music

- Timetabled Curriculum: KS3 students receive at least one hour per week of music education.
- Areas Covered:
 - o **Performing:** Singing, instrumental work, ensemble playing.
 - o **Composing:** Musical notation, improvisation, and music technology.
 - Listening & Appraising: Exploring different musical styles, cultures, and historical periods.
- Cross-Curricular Links:
 - Music & Technology: Project-based work where students create soundtracks for animations or video games using DAWs (GarageBand, BandLab, Audacity).
 - Music & Drama: Collaborative performances where students compose original scores for theatre productions.
- **Assessment:** Regular tracking of students' progress through performances, composition projects, and listening exercises.

Plan B: Co-Curricular Music

- Instrumental & Vocal Opportunities:
 - Peripatetic Lessons: Access to instrumental lessons across a variety of instruments.
 - Choir & Vocal Training: Students can join school choirs and vocal ensembles.
 - School Band & Ensembles: Including rock bands and contemporary music groups are developing.
- Rehearsal & Practice Space: Dedicated spaces available for individual and group rehearsals.
- Progression Pathways: Opportunities to achieve graded music exams and performance-based awards are encouraged.
- Subsidised Tuition & Inclusion: Information available on support for pupil premium students on request.

Plan C: Musical Experiences

- Annual School Productions: Collaborative music and drama performances (e.g., musicals, plays with live music).
- Concerts & assembly performances Termly showcases featuring soloists, ensembles, and class performances.
- **Live Music Exposure:** Opportunities for students to attend live performances at least **once per year**.
- Music Technology in Performance: Students lead on sound design, live mixing, and backing tracks for drama productions, as well as in music lessons
- Partnerships with Music Hubs & Professionals: Engagement with Lincs Music Hub and professional musicians for workshops and performance opportunities.

Future Development

- Expand cross-curricular links with Technology and Drama.
- Increase access to instrumental lessons and ensemble participation.
- Develop more community performance opportunities.
- Strengthen links with Lincs Music Hub and external organisations.
- Invest in digital music technology for enhanced composition and production opportunities.
