Year 10	Natural Forms –

	Rankin. Our students work their way through
	the assessment objectives to develop, refine,
	record and present their findings.
Year 11	Collections –
	Students will follow their studies in Year 10
	with a shorter project looking at typology. They
	will investigate the work of Olivia Parker and
	Barry Rosenthal to understand the stories
	behind their photographic collections in order
	to develop their own. Students will have the
	opportunity to develop their skillset using a
	variety of appropriate techniques to set them
