Our Learning

We have been...

- Finding out about who celebrates Chinese New Year and how and why
- Listening to the story of the Chinese Zodiac
- Making Chinese dragons and penguins in our creative area
- Continuing to look out for different birds in our garden
- Pretending to celebrate Chinese new year in our home corner
- Exploring using chopsticks to complete a funky fingers challenge

<u>Little Chicks</u> have been drawing their favourite arctic animals, counting objects and matching them to the correct numeral and using different positional vocabulary to describe where a bear is, learning the Jolly Phonics songs for the letters m and n and using different tools safely to hammer 'nails' into blocks of 'ice.'

<u>Ducklings</u> have been writing facts about the Arctic and Antarctic, sorting and ordering objects according to their size and length, ordering numbers, using positional vocabulary to describe where something is and in phonics learning the phonemes ch, sh, th, ng, ai and ee and practising handwriting them cursively and blending to read words with them in and learning to read and write more of the tricky words - he, she, we, me, be, was and all.



Our Learning

This week's learning will be all about Love, loving yourself and others around you. We will be reading stories such as Love Splat and Guess How Much I Love You? and talking about who and what they love and why. We will also make a love flower out of all of the things that they love. They will be using their funky fingers to scrunch up tissue paper

and decorate hearts. We will discuss how we are similar or different to our friends and to learn to respect each other's differences.

It will be Safer Internet Day, so we will discover more about how to be safe when we are using certain devices. Little Chicks will learn the Jolly Phonics songs for o and p. Ducklings will continue to learn the new phonemes igh, oa and oo.

This Friday we will be having a Visual Awareness Day in aid of charity. As part of this the children will try to find out more about what it might be like to be visually impaired and how they have to overcome their difficulties through listening to others and trying out some fun activities whereby we use blind folds to simulate what it must be like ourselves.

When we return from the half-term holiday, it will be Pancake day or Shrove Tuesday that week. We hope to make our very own pancakes (egg and diary free!) and to find out why this day is celebrated, how and why.

How can you help at home?

Little Chicks

Share stories together and talk about your favourite part of the book and why.

Look for numbers when you are out and about everywhere.

Make some pancakes.

Talk for Mathematics

Play skittles. How many did you have to begin with? How many knocked down? How many are left?


Count out some objects/toys at home. Ask your child to count them then tell them you are going to take some away.

Count the ones taken away and the total of toys left. Verbally say the number sentence, e.g. 3 - 2 = 1

Find 1 less than a group of objects or a given number.

Sing some taking away songs such as Ten Green Bottles and Five Little Speckled Frogs.

Talk for Reading and Writing

Practise any letters/sounds and tricky words that you are still unsure of.

Write sentences with the tricky words in or look for them in your reading books.

Practise writing the new sounds as we learn them and making sure that we use our cursive handwriting all of the time.

Practise writing words with our new sounds in such as night, coat, book and week. Try writing sentences with these words in, for e.g. At night I go to sleep.

Play the tricky words snakes and ladders games.
