Little Chicks

We have been...

- Reading all about the nativity story and sequencing it
- Dressing up as the different nativity characters
- Making Christmas cards and calendars
- Writing Christmas lists
- Doing lots of Christmas themed counting and number recognition

Ducklings

We have been...

- Reading, retelling and writing the nativity story
- Finding out who celebrates Christmas and why. Talking about how different families celebrate Christmas in their homes and what advent means
- Finding out about Christmas around the world in different countries
- Writing letters and lists to Father Christmas
- Estimating groups of objects and then checking by counting accurately
- Counting collections of objects and matching to the correct numeral
- In Phonics we have been carrying out assessments to find out which sounds and tricky words we know and to be able to break simple words down into their different sounds.



Our Learning

We have listened to the children's interests and have planned to start a new topic next half-term entitled, 'Once Upon A Time.' We will be learning through the theme of princesses, knights, dragons and castles! We will begin our topic with some traditional fairy tales such as Snow White and the seven Dwarfs and The Princess and the Pea. Look in the curriculum section of the school website for more information about our topic. We will begin by looking in the 'magic mirror' and discussing what makes us special and our different talents. We will read different versions of the stories and use the familiar story language in our own writing.

In mathematics Little Chicks will be comparing numbers and saying when they have the same amount. The Ducklings will be using real-life objects to add two groups together to find the total.

In our creative learning we will be making our own crowns with patterns on and exploring how to play instruments in different ways.

The Ducklings will be starting to learn to identify and apply a new phase of letters and sounds in phonics.

Our outdoor learning will take on more of a seasonal theme based on winter, observing the changes to the weather and our garden and helping to look after the plants and animals throughout this time.



Reminders

<u>Reading</u>

As well as reading regularly (every night if possible!) please practise the letter and sound flashcards to help your child to retain their phonics learning. Also, refer to the phonics assessment sheet sent home in your child's reading record to see what it is they need to practise or are still unsure of.

How can you help at home?

Little Chicks

Read some different princess, knights, dragons and castle stories or information books together Practise comparing different numbers/amounts and saying when they are the same Play games with simple rules or turn taking games together over the holiday

Ducklings

Talk for Mathematics

Estimate how many objects are in a group and then check by counting, for e.g. how many red baubles on the tree, or apples in the fruit bowl.

Find the total of two different amounts by counting on, for e.g. 4 cars in the garage and 2 more join them. Now there are 4... 5, <u>6</u> altogether. Make sure your child understands a range of vocabulary such as add, makes, totals, altogether, equals and plus when doing practical adding with real-life objects. Make your own addition number stories up, such as "I have 2 biscuits and Daddy gives me another one, so now I have 3 altogether." <u>www.ictgames.com/numeracy</u> <u>www.topmarks.co.uk</u>
