Our Learning

The children have loved reading lots of different stories about pirates and used these as a stimulus to write for different purposes such as a day in the life of a pirate, writing messages to put in bottles, making WANTED posters and much, much more!

In mathematics Little Chicks have been looking for numbers around the environment and sorting objects according to their size or length. The Ducklings have been finding ordering numbers and then exploring different ways to make a particular number, by adding two numbers together - number bonds.

In the creative area the children have enjoyed creating their own pirate flags and eye patches, using a variety of tools and materials safely.

In the investigation area they have helped Marissa the Mermaid. She had lost some of her scales and needed to find a waterproof material to keep her tail dry until the new scales grew back. The children were able to discover which materials would make the best waterproof tail by testing out their ideas.

Outside the children have enjoyed completing treasure hunts finding the number clues and investigating if the pirate boats they have made can float and carry pirate passengers!



What we will be learning next

Over the next week we will be bringing our sea themed topic to a close by finding out what the seaside was like in the past compared with today. We will look at different places and features that you might find at the seaside and will be learning all about different types of sea transport.

When we return from our half-term holiday, we will begin a new colour themed topic. This will focus on feelings and emotions and preparing for transition and change, as well as exploring mixing colours creatively.

As part of their PSED and Physical Development, the Ducklings will be using some of their PE time to complete the Stage 1 Lancashire road safety programme. We complete this in small groups over a number of weeks. We do this just a very short distance away from school. You have all completed a permission slip regarding this at the start of the year with your induction packs. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask your child's class teacher.

How can you help at home?

Little Chicks

Find objects beginning with t and u when out and about or around the home.

Practise doing some dot-to-dot activities and saying the numbers in order.

Talk for Mathematics

Make some number cards 1-20. Shuffle them. Pick 4 or 5 random numbers and see if you can put them in ascending order or descending order.

Put magnetic numbers in order.

Chalk numbers in order on the garden patio/path.

Get 10 small objects for e.g. green and black grapes. Explore different ways to make 10 using the two groups. Using building blocks or Lego, build towers of ten in different ways using one or two colours. Say the pairs of numbers that you have found to make 10make 10.

Make a counting hand to help you explore making 10 (number bonds) in lots of different ways. Write the addition sums.

Talk for Reading and Writing

Read your reading book each day. Read additional books on Oxford Owl when you can.

Get a grown up to ask you some how or why questions about your book. Retell the book in your own words.

Practise the phonics flashcards and tricky word games. Practise writing all of the tricky words.

Complete the phonics activities on Education City.

Practise writing longer words that a grown up tells you with two or more syllables – such as lunchbox, desktop, shampoo, handstand, giftbox, melting, sandpit.

Look for longer words in your reading books and in books at home.

Try writing some simple sentences with these words in.

Talk for topic
