# Our Learning

We have been...

- Finding out about the season of winter and reading a lovely story all about Jack Frost
- Learning and singing some winter themed songs ask them to sing them to you!
- Exploring how water changes into ice and investigating and observing ice melting
- Finding out about life in the polar regions of the Arctic and Antarctic
- Enjoying making (and eating!) melting snowman biscuits
- Bird spotting in the school garden and making apple and sunflower seed bird feeders

<u>Little Chicks</u> have been making Jack Frost pictures with different media such as salt and glue, chalking snowflakes on our blackboards, learning more of the Jolly Phonics songs, mark making in the 'snow', describing the position of a toy using the correct mathematical vocabulary and creating junk model penguins.

<u>Ducklings</u> have been writing all bout Jack Frost and thinking about what might make their snowman melt, estimating the number of objects and checking by counting, learning to add the total of two groups of objects and numbers by counting on, exploring the distance between different objects and using the appropriate vocabulary, designing and constructing sledges in DT and collecting and printing with winter leaves and branches and throwing snowballs with increasing aim at targets and in phonics learning the phonemes j, v, w, x, y, qu and z and practising handwriting them cursively and blending to read words with them in.



# Our Learning

The Ducklings and Little Chicks will be finding out all about who celebrates Chinese New Year, how and why. We will decorate our home corner and turn it into a home ready for celebrating this special occasion in. We will listen to the story of the Chinese Zodiac and find out why it is the Year of the Rat this time. We will also be reading a book called, 'The Magic Paintbrush' together and imagine what we would paint if we too had a magic brush. In our creative learning we will make paper dragons and lanterns and outside we will sing, dance and play instruments whilst appeting our game dragon. To and our week we will be beginned visited associated as head.

instruments whilst creating our own dragon dances. To end our week we will be having a visitor coming into school to teach us how to do a dragon dance. We then hope to perform it to the rest of the school.

In mathematics the Ducklings will be exploring comparing, describing and ordering using the focus of length and then introducing the opposite of adding by exploring subtraction practically. The Little Chicks will be counting objects to 10 and beyond and matching to the correct numeral.

The Ducklings will continue their phonics by looking beginning to look at digraphs (2 letters that make a single sound) such as sh, ch and th.

After our Chinese New Year theme we will continue with our learning all about very cold places in the world. Early next week, we will have a visit and a talk by a parent who used to live in Norway, to tell us all about what it is like to live where it is very cold! We will also have another visitor later on in the week to talk to us about their Muslim faith as part of our RE topic and getting to know how we are all similar and different.

As well as reading regularly (every night if possible!) please practise the letter and sound flashcards to help your child to retain their phonics learning, also playing the tricky word games to help them learn these new words.

# Little Chicks

Place a toy in different places and positions and ask the children to describe where they are using the correct prepositions.

Talk with your child about what they have been learning at school. They know lots of facts about Winter and the Arctic and Antarctic.

# **Ducklings**

## Talk for Mathematics

Try estimating how many objects there are and check by counting. Whose guess was the most accurate?! Talk about distance. Place different toys on the carpet. Talk about the distance between them. Use vocabulary such as near, far, closest, furthest, further, closer, nearer, etc. How can you measure the distance? Count footsteps, use a line of building blocks, or pencils in a line, etc.

Practise adding practically using dominoes and dice and other practical objects to add the total of the two amounts.

Record the + sums using the correct symbols.

Tell each other word problems to solve, for e.g. I have 5 bananas and then I buy 3 apples. How much fruit do I have altogether?
