Our Learning

We have come to the end of our People Who Help Us topic and have been very lucky to have more people to come and talk to us about their special jobs. We have had a visit from a train driver, another police officer, a student nurse and a pathology nurse, a music teacher, Mr Luty the school caretaker, Mrs Deaville in the school office and the school cook. The children have been excellent at listening and are really good at thinking of questions to ask our visitors.

We have enjoyed lots of role-play during this topic in our class police station, our hospital and this week our hair dressing salon.

We have explored doing the job of a recycling collector and helping to sort the recycling according to the materials they are made from.

For our art days we enjoyed reading a lovely story called 'The Dot' about a little girl who doesn't believe that she can be an artist, until her teacher just tells her to start by making a single mark. The children then used this idea to explore colours with different tools to make their own dot pictures.

Little Chicks

We have been...

- Sponge printing the letters in their names
- Counting out the correct number of objects and identifying which group has more or less
- Looking at what happens when we add more to a group or take some away
- Drawing what they would like to be when they grow up

Ducklings

We have been...

- Writing facts about people who help us and drawing and writing about what job they would like to be when they grow up
- Creating and completing repeating patterns all around us using all different kinds of resources
- Exploring 1 more and 1 less than a given number by counting on or back, using a number line or by simply counting a group of actual objects and taking 1 away or adding 1 more to help
- Practising our scissor cutting skills

- Applying our phonics skills to be able read words and simple sentences independently
- Learning to read the tricky words I, the, no, go, to and into.



Our Learning

Over the remaining weeks we will be learning all about Christmas and joining in with the season's celebrations. Next week we will be continuing to practise our nativity play ready for our dress rehearsal and then our performances the following week. Next week we will be focusing on the nativity story and why Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus. We will be retelling and ordering the events in the nativity story, as well as dressing up in nativity costumes to act it out! We will be busy making our crafts ready for the Christmas fair and busy creating our own Christmas cards and decorations. The following week we will be finding out about how Christmas is celebrated in our homes and around the world. We will talk about how different families have different traditions. Our home corner and role play areas will be decorated and turned into Christmas at home and a Santa's Grotto. We will also be creating our own Bethlehem stable role play area.

Little Chicks will be looking for different shapes around them and learning the Jolly Phonics songs for the letters h and i.

The Ducklings will be completing the phase of phonics that we have been currently learning and will be recapping over all of the sounds that we have learnt so far, as well as the tricky words and assessing the children to find out what they know and what they need to keep practising. As our first term at school draws to an end, the Ducklings' teachers will also be finding out what the children have learnt and remembered so far in terms of their reading, writing and mathematics by completing little assessment activities with them,

Nativity Costumes and Lines

Please can all costumes for the nativity be in school, in a named carrier bag, by $\underline{\text{Friday 6}^{\text{th}}}$ December at the latest as we will be performing on this day for the rest of the school in our dress rehearsal.

You can also send in any costumes as soon as you have them ready and we can keep them in school. Please put all costumes in a <u>named</u> carrier bag. Some costumes may need other clothing to wear underneath, such as dark blue or black tops and trousers/tights for the stars and white tops and leggings, tights or trousers for the angels. Please put these in their named bag too.

If you are unsure or have any further questions, please just pop in and speak to one of us. Many thanks! Please could all children with a speaking part practise the lines that they have to learn? They are stuck in their reading journals that they bring home.

How can you help at home?

Little Chicks

Read some different nativity stories together

Practise counting objects around the home and look for different shapes around the home

Listen out for objects around the home that begin with the h and i sounds

Ducklings

Talk for Mathematics

Practise counting collections of objects up to 20 accurately

Practise writing numbers to 20 in different ways – outside with chalk on the path, with a stick in the sand or mud, in a tray of rice or flour!

Look at numbers on doors. Which number would be 1 more or 1 less?

Practising counting forwards and backwards from different numbers

Talk for Reading and Writing

Find objects when you are at home and out and about that start with the sounds b,f and I.

Look out for words that have a double letter in like ff, ss or II, such as miss or will

Practise writing these letters in sand or with chalk

Look for these letters in books at home.

Practise reading and writing the phase 2 'tricky' words - I, go, no, to, the and into. Look for these tricky words in your reading books and books at home

Watch Geraldine the Giraffe (+ the letter/sound) - phonics clips and watch and sing the Jolly Phonics songs on YouTube

Write the message in your Christmas cards, using your cursive handwriting!
