Our Learning

The children are still very much enjoying the garden topic. They have learnt lots about the life cycle of a butterfly and have loved reading and retelling The Very Hungry Caterpillar story. They have thoroughly enjoyed having minibeast treasure hunts outside and have been going exploring looking for minibeasts in different places around school such as the garden, the field, on the playground and so on. They have been busy building and creating caterpillars in the construction and creative areas. They have loved observing the real-life butterflies; feeding, them, drawing them and researching for more information about them. Today we released them into our lovely garden and hope to see them flying around in their new surroundings.

Little Chicks have been...

- Drawing what the hungry caterpillar liked to eat
- Sequencing the main events from The Very Hungry Caterpillar story and retelling the story with props
- Recognising numbers to 10 and finger printing those numbers to make caterpillars

<u>Ducklings</u> have been...

- Continuing to read and write words with pairs of consonants at the beginning or end of words
- Designing and drawing up plans for how to make a bug hotel for Billy the Beetle and his other garden friends
- Solving mathematics problems related to grouping, sharing and sorting
- Programming the Beebots and directing them around the garden



What we will be learning next

Over the next few weeks we will be continuing with our What's in the Garden? topic, with a focus on different minibeasts. Next week we will be reading non-fiction books about butterflies as well as stories such as The Munching, Crunching Caterpillar. We will also read another story by Eric Carle called The Very Busy Spider. We will continue to hunt for mini-beasts and find out where they like to live and why. Little Chicks will be ordering caterpillars according to their size and length. The Ducklings will be looking at weight and comparing the foods that the hungry caterpillar ate. Little Chicks will be listening for rhyming pairs and continuing a rhyming string. The Ducklings will be writing their own information texts about caterpillars and butterflies.

It is also healthy living week so we will be doing lots of physical activities outside along with our sports' day. We will be designing a healthy packed lunch and making healthy fruit smoothies for our snack time.

How can you help at home?

Little Chicks

Place objects in order according to their size/length. Look for numbers and letters in the environment and send photos in to share.

Ducklings

Talk for Mathematics

Compare different fruits and vegetables and place in order according to their weight.

Put out different numbers of plates or bowls and share out (fairly) some dried pasta or play food.

Keep a diary for a week of what you eat each day, just like the Very Hungry Caterpillar.

Write the days of the week and draw something that you do each day.

Create some word problems of your own for the Very Hungry Caterpillar and illustrate them, For e.g. The caterpillar eats 4 strawberries and 5 oranges. Altogether it ate 9 fruits.

Talk for Reading and Writing

Read and talk about your book every night.

Practise the phonics flashcards and tricky word games. Practise writing all of the tricky words and words with the different phonemes in.

Practise spelling words with 2 consonants at the beginning and end of the words, for e.g. plant, stamp.

Write your own hungry caterpillar story.

Using the letters in the word caterpillar, what words can you make? For example pat, rap.
