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Hawks class would like to thank everyone for their support with bringing in items for the Foodbank. They received an overwhelming response that was very much appreciated. EYFS collected 27 hair products, KS1 collected 28 wash products, LKS2 collected 32 tins, UKS2 collected 59 longlife milk/juice along with 12 miscellaneous items that were welcomed.

As we structure our school to learn together in our phases we have organised our curriculum to match. Throughout school the children are currently learning about aspects of the past. You might notice that the boulders at the front of school have stone-age art work using paint that they made from natural products.



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In the spring term we all will be focussing on places and the summer term concentrating upon our living world. To enhance the teaching taking place all teachers have been tasked with thinking about how to inspire the children further with inviting visitors to school or to take the learning beyond the classroom. These additional elements to the curriculum come at a cost that school is able to partly fund. We ask for contributions to assist us please.
