Each class have planned some wonderful lessons for their children along with trips to enhance the learning experience. We have asked for financial assistance towards these trips/activities and unfortunately, we are currently incredibly short as a school.

Ducklings (45 pupils) are £1010.10 in deficit with just 8 families having sent any contributions into school.

KS1 (90 pupils) are £757.50 in deficit with 31 families having made their contributions.

Lower KS2(90 pupils) are £901.45 short with 34 families having supported us.

Upper KS2 (90 pupils) are £1374.29 in deficit with 38 families having made their contributions.

I am sure you can realise from digesting the above figures that planning trips and activities that school already subsidises heavily cannot be sustained without the contributions from each family. Upper KS2 have already enjoyed the Viking Day and the bill has had to be paid for totally by school.
