We have enjoyed a fabulous and incredibly busy fortnight at school. All our children at Carleton Green have a skill or talent in some area. To celebrate our strengths and uniqueness we spent last week considering ways that they may be able to leave their mark. We enjoyed reading The Dot as our starting point for this work with a local artist then teaching the children all about wet felting. Each of our KS2 pupils have produced their very own wet felt dot which will be displayed in our stairwells.

We also rely significantly upon our families to work with us in promoting positive behaviour so that our pupils develop to be successful in their future lives at High School and beyond.
